DAC MEETINGS . .

For an annual fee of only £15 per person or £ 25 per couple DAC members can enjoy a varied programme of monthly demonstrations and talks by visiting Artists. The demonstrations cover a wide range of mediums and subject matter. Visitors to DAC are also welcome to come along to these sessions for a small payment of £5 which is deducted from their fee if they then decide to join the club within a month of their visit.

One of the highlights of 2012 was the special two night sessions on April 16th and 17th with renowned husband and wife team; David Bellamy, watercolourist and Jenny Keal, pastel artist.

On Monday David demonstrated his skills by painting a scene of the delightfully named 'Low Snockrigg' mountain from a sketch he had made whilst in the Lake

District near Buttermere.

On Tuesday evening Jenny chose to create a pastel painting from a sketch she had made that day after being captivated by the shapes and colours of our local landscapes. There was a full house at each of the two nights with over 100 members and visitors attending the meetings.

Saturday February 4th 2012 Workshop with Yorkshire wild life artistJohn Naylor



About 20 Members of DAC enjoyed the workshop at Nafferton which included an excellent demonstration and talk by East Yorkshire Artist John Naylor (above). John specialises in animal paintings using pastels and has a very unique style which the members were invited to follow. John based his workshop demonstration on a photograph of a delightful Bassett Hound puppy. He had taken great pains to capture a suitable pose with his camera as the puppy was very lively! John paints from life wherever possible, sometimes raising his own subjects from young - animals such as hares and birds - which, having been captured in pastels, are then carefully integrated into life in the wild before being released into their natural habitat.

As always at DAC workshops, members were free to choose to paint their own subject. On this occasion Club President Hector Fraser painted a colourful rowan tree and artist Jill Grinstead painted an atmospheric landscape - but most members chose to paint the hound.

The paintings produced by the members at the workshop were of an extremely high standard and everyone agreed they had thoroughly enjoyed the day.
